THE CROSS

Mark 15:16-39

Point: 1

The cross tells us sin is costly .

(Psa 51:4 NIV)

Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are proved right when you speak and justified when you judge.

(Rom 1:18 NIV)

The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of men who suppress the truth by their wickedness,

"Before we can begin to see that the cross is something done for us, we have to see that it is something done by us" John Stott

Point: 2

The cross tells us that God takes sin seriously.

(Mark 15:34)

At the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, Iama sabachthani?" which is translated, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?"

Point: 3

The cross tells us that God's love for us is **great**.

"The most perplexing theological question is not why there's suffering in this world, but why God tolerates us in our sinfulness.

R.C Sproul

(Mark 14:36 NIV)

"Abba, Father," he said,
"everything is possible for
you. Take this cup from
me. Yet not what I will, but
what you will."

(Hebrews 5:8-9 NIV)

Although he was a son, he learned obedience from what he suffered. And being made perfect, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him;

(Romans 5:19 NIV)

For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.

(1 John 4:9 NIV)

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

Point: 4

The cross tells us our need for a mediator.

(1 Tim 2:5-6 NIV)

For there is one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all men--the testimony given in its proper time.

(Romans 5:9 NIV)

Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him!

The glory of the gospel is that the one from whom we need to be save, is the one who has saved us.

R.C. Sproul

(John 3:16-18 NIV)

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

(John 3:16-18 NIV)

Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son.
