### Deepen our reliance upon Jesus - without this we can do nothing

• John 15:5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.

### Continue to lay basic foundational doctrines - this is needed for maturity

• Hebrews 6:1-2 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God, (2) Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

### <u>Develop leadership</u> - it is His way of solving problems and meeting needs

- Titus 1:5 For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting, and ordain elders in every city, as I had appointed thee:
- Acts 6:2-3 Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables. (3) Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business.

### 2013 - Focus on our Mission

REFLECTING Jesus Christ & REACHING Our City

**Isaiah 37:31** "Once more a remnant of the kingdom of Judah will **take root below and bear fruit above**."

- "Roots Downward and Fruit Above" describes the growth of a tree simultaneously in two directions roots below and fruit above...a great illustration for our 2013 focus.
- John 15:5 "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.
- It is important that we remain rooted in Christ and His word, so that our fruitfulness springs from a relationship to Him.



### A Disciple is One Who is Becoming Like His Master ... ... Roots Downward

Luke 6:40 A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher.

#### A Disciple is One Who is Bearing Fruit ... ... Fruit Upward

John 15:8 This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

# **Discipleship Groups**

A discipleship group is **3** people who meet **1** time per week for **1** hour to do **3** things. A group of three is like the 3-fold cord: Ecc 4:12 And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

This is one way for us to engage in becoming and making disciples. We can pursue roots downward as well as fruit upward.

### Three Components of a Discipleship Group

- 1. Discuss the week's Bible reading
  - Joh 8:31 To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples.
    - We are building a discipline of reading God's word
    - We are learning to hear His voice
    - We are being taught by the Holy Spirit
- 2. Discuss where the Lord is pursuing growth in our lives
  - Mat 10:25 It is enough for the disciple that he be as his master, and the servant as his lord.
    - o He who began a good work in us and will perform it until the day of Christ
- 3. Pray for unsaved friends and family who do not yet know the LORD
  - Mat 4:19 And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.
    - This keeps us engaged in evangelism
    - Every person in our geography an opportunity to hear the gospel
    - o if you shared the gospel 1 x per week = 52 presentations
    - o if 30 of us shared the gospel 1 x per week = 1,560 presentations

Outreach Night (Fruit Upward)

I am envisioning a night of the week (Thursdays) when we would meet together for short time of prayer, encouragement and planning, then move outside the four walls of the church and focus on reaching out to people. You could be part of this on a weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly basis.

#### What would it look like

- Reach out and visit members who are struggling
- Reach out and visit people who have visited the church
  - o Over 280 people have visited ACC this past year
  - o Our current follow up is to send a letter
  - We can step it up, go visit them, pray for them, encourage them see if there is a need
- Reach out in evangelism friends we know, our neighborhood, etc or to people we
  are sending cards to (those who move in our city), people we are praying for in our
  discipleship groups
- Prayer Team Phil Dudek has a burden to pray for the vision of the church perhaps others could pray with him on this night

#### It is time to pass on the things we have received

- Matthew 10:6-8 Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. (7) As you go, proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' (8) Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. **Freely you have received; freely give.**
- Genesis 12:2 "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing.

### **Reaching Into Our Community**

When I speak of community - I am talking about a regional area that encompasses the reach of our church (about 11 miles diameter)

#### Our City Evangelism - every person a chance to hear the gospel


- Can we reach out to families (Funerals, Birth of a child, Weddings)
