

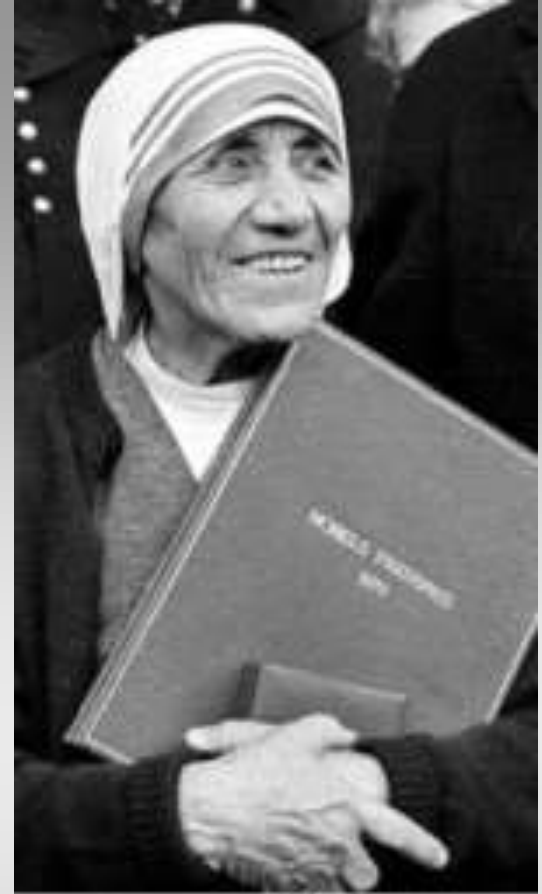

A haughty spirit	<i>Ps 138:6 Though the LORD is on high, he looks upon the lowly, but the proud he knows from afar.</i>
Self-protective pride	<i>James 4:6 God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.</i>
Unapproachable pride	<i>Prov 9:8 Do not rebuke a mocker or he will hate you; rebuke a wise man and he will love you.</i>
Know-It-All pride	<i>1 Cor 8:1 Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up.</i>
Self-Exalting pride	<i>Prov 27:2 Let another praise you, and not your own mouth; someone else, and not your own lips</i>
Un-submissive pride	<i>Heb 13:17 Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you.</i>
