The Kingdom of God is at Hand - Repent and Believe

Mar 1:14-15 ESV Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the **gospel** of God, 15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

Kingdom at hand <u>[a new regime is here]</u> THEREFORE Change your <u>thinking - direction</u>

Act 17:30-31 ESV The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now **he commands all people everywhere to repent**, 31 <u>because</u> he has fixed a day on which <u>he will judge the world</u> in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

- The call to repent & believe is an act of mercy & grace
- There is a new regime, and you are all guilty of rebellion against it, but Jesus came
- And offers PEACE --- BEFORE he returns to judge [he did it by dying for our rebellion]
- 2Th 1:9 ...inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. They will suffer the punishment of eternal destruction

Mat 21:23-32 ESV And when he entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came up to him as he was teaching, and said, "*By what authority are you doing these things*, and who gave you this authority?"

• Why do people question the authority of another? - Who do you think you are?

24 Jesus answered them, "I also will ask you one question, and if you tell me the answer, then I also will tell you by what authority I do these things. 25 <u>The baptism of John, from where did it come? From heaven or from man?</u>" And they discussed it among themselves, saying, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' 26 But if we say, 'From man,' we are afraid of the crowd, for they all hold that John was a prophet." 27 So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I do these things.

They gave a political answer - they would not commit - (fear of commitment)

The Story - repentance is linked to the will of the father (a response to authority)

28 "What do you think? A man had two sons. And he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' 29 And he answered, 'I will not,' but **afterward** *he changed his mind and went*. 30 And he went to the other son and said the same. And he answered, 'I go, sir,' but did not go. 31 *Which of the two did the will of his father?"* They said, "The first."

The moral of the story (the repentance of others should move us to do the same)

Jesus said to them, "Truly, I say to you, the <u>tax collectors</u> and the <u>prostitutes go into the kingdom of God before you.</u> 32 For John came to you in the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him. And <u>even when you saw it</u>, *you did not afterward change your minds and believe him*.

Repentance is the constant turning to the will of the Father

- Repentance is the first step to be initiated into the kingdom of God -
- It is also an ongoing surrender to Christ as we grow and learn more of His ways
- Our burden and ability to repent is based on our receiving of Christ's authority
- The first son is like the tax collectors and prostitutes (and us)
- The second son is like the religious leaders words but no works
