*NIV - accurately says sixty pounds of flour

The Lord visited Abraham

Gen 18:6 And Abraham went quickly into the tent to Sarah and said, "Quick! Three seahs [kjv measures] of fine flour! Knead it, and make cakes."

Gen 18 a Monumental Day for 2 reasons

- 1) The timing of the birth of <u>Abraham's</u> <u>promised son</u> was finally revealed
- 2) The Lord came down to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah
