The Ordination of George Hill as an Elder at ACC

Elders - What are they? God designed elders to serve as the leadership structure of the local church

- Tit 1:5 ESV This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might *put what remained into order*, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you-- [NIV *put in order what was left unfinished*]
 - **Appoint -** to place down (permanently), that is, (figuratively) to designate, (appoint, ordain, set)
- Act 14:21-23 ESV When they had preached the gospel to that city and had made many disciples, they
 returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch......23 And when they had appointed [KJV ordained]
 elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom
 they had believed.
 - o **Appointed** (to stretch out the hand); to select or appoint, choose, ordain

Elders - What do they do?

An elder is a steward of GOD'S CHURCH, called by the Holy Spirit to watch over His flock

 Act 20:28 ESV Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care [poimaino] for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood.

An elder seeks to know the condition of the flock

• Pro 27:23 ESV Know well the condition of your flocks, and give attention to your herds,

An elder leads with God's heart

 Jer 3:15 ESV "And I will give you shepherds after my own heart, who will feed you with knowledge and understanding.

He leads with integrity and skill

• Psa 78:72 KJV [God took David from the sheepfold to lead his people] So he fed them according to the *integrity of his heart*; and guided them by the *skilfulness of his hands*.

How are they chosen? By the Holy Spirit, and by the man's personal desire

- Act 20:28 ESV Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the <u>Holy Spirit has</u>
 <u>made [appoint-ordain]</u> you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood.
- 1Ti 3:1 ESV The saying is trustworthy: **If anyone aspires** to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task.

How Are They Chosen? (mostly character qualities, and a couple skills)

1Ti 3:1-7 ESV The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. 2 Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, **able to teach**, 3 not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. 4 He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, 5 for if someone does not **know how to manage his own household**, how will he care for God's church? 6 He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. 7 Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil.

There is The Laying on of Hands

For Blessing, for healing, for receiving the baptism in the Holy Spirit, and for ordination

• Mar 10:16 ESV And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands on them.

For Healing

- Jesus Luk 4:40 [Jesus] he laid his hands on every one of them and healed them.
- Jesus Luk 13:12 [Jesus] he laid his hands on her, and immediately she was made straight
- Church Act 9:12 [Ananias] lay his hands on him [Paul] so that he might regain his sight.
- Church Act 28:8 [Paul] putting his hands on him [Publius] healed him.
- Church Mar 16:16-18 ESV Whoever believes will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover."

For Baptism in the Holy Spirit

- Act 19:6 ESV [Paul] laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they began speaking in tongues and prophesying.
- Act 8:17 ESV Then they [Peter & John] laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit.

For ordaining into ministry (a gift from God acknowledged by the body of elders)

- 1Ti 4:14 ESV Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophecy when the council of elders laid their hands on you.
- 2Ti 1:6 ESV For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands,

A great example of what happens when someone is ordained

- Act 13:1-4 ESV Now there were in the church at Antioch <u>prophets and teachers</u>, Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a lifelong friend of Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. 2 While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." 3 Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off. 4 So, being sent out by the Holy Spirit, they went down to Seleucia, and from there they sailed to Cyprus.
- Act 14:14 ESV But when the <u>apostles</u> Barnabas and Paul heard of it, they tore their garments and rushed out into the crowd, crying out,

Hands were laid on them to

- 1. **Recognize** the Holy Spirit's call (the Holy Spirit said set apart for the work to which I have called)
- 2. **Confirm & Acknowledge** after fasting and prayer, they laid hands on them
- 3. **Release them to function in this new role** give them authority (**sent them off** = released them)
- 4. Spirit now leads so being sent out by the Holy Spirit
- 5. **There was a divine Impartation** there was an impartation of grace and apostleship that comes from God (14:14)
