Blessed are the Poor in Spirit

Series: The Sermon on the Mount

Matt 4:17 From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

As crowds gathered, he taught about that kingdom and began with The Beatitudes "the blessed life"

- Many of them are counter-intuitive (poor in spirit, mourn, persecuted)
- It shows there is something about the kingdom that apart from Jesus, we would never comprehend

Matt 5:3 ESV Blessed are the poor in spirit...theirs is the kingdom of heaven

- It is not an economic statement, it is statement about our spirit → "blessed are the poor in spirit"
- POOR Shrink or cower or cringe, beggar with hand reaching out for alms (what if this was our spirit?)
- The lame man(carried) acts 3 ask alms -- Lazarus (laid) desiring even crumbs, dogs licked sores

<u>Theirs is the kingdom</u> -- a gift to those who recognize we are poor spiritually (we bring nothing)

- Eph 2:8-10 ESV For by **grace** you have been saved through faith. And **this is not your own doing**; it is the **gift of God**, 9 **not** a result **of works**, **so that no one may boast**.
- Salvation is the greatest blessing given to the least deserving

Some examples -- they had nothing -- but in the Lord they found all they needed- they "asked alms"

Isaiah "I am a man of unclean lips" (Isa 6:5)	Moses "Who am I?" (Ex 3:11)
Gideon "family is the least in Manasseh" (Jud 6:15)	Peter "Depart, for I am a sinful man." (Luke 5:8)
Jeremiah "I do not know how to speak" (Jer 1:6)	Paul "I am the chiefest of sinners." (I Tim 1:15)

Spiritual Pride vs Poor in Spirit --- Luk 18:9-14 ESV He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt: 10 "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. 11 The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. 12 I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.' 13 But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Paul saw Jesus for who he is -- moved to become poor in spirit, and wanted nothing more than Him
Php 3:3-11 ESV For we are the circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and
put no confidence in the flesh-- 4 though I myself have reason for confidence in the flesh also. If anyone
else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: 5 circumcised on the eighth day, of the
people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; 6 as to zeal, a
persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. 7 But whatever gain I had, I counted
as loss for the sake of Christ. 8 Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of
knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as
rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that
comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that
depends on faith-- 10 that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings,
becoming like him in his death, 11 that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Summary - **Spiritual pride?** Looking down? Comparing? Need of nothing?- pray you can find humility **Poor in spirit?** - not doing poorly, recognizing right place with God, and look to him for help - a beautiful place **Are you wanting to know Christ**, to gain Christ to the point that you are willing to count everything as dung?
