Sinless or Sin-Less?

Justification & Sanctification

- <u>Romans 8:15-16</u>: For you have not received a spirit of slavery leading to fear again, but you have received a **spirit of adoption as sons and daughters** by which we cry out, "Abba! Father!" 16 The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of God, (Galatians 4)
- <u>Romans 8:23</u>: And not only that, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, **waiting eagerly for our adoption as sons and daughters**, the redemption of our body.

- <u>Ephesians 1:7:</u> In Him **we have redemption** through His blood, the forgiveness of our wrongdoings, according to the riches of His grace 8 which He lavished on us. In all wisdom and insight
- <u>Ephesians 4:30:</u> Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed **for the day of redemption.**

Reasons Why These Doctrines are Important

- Romans 3:24: being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus,
- Ephesians 2:8 For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not of yourselves, it is the gift of God;

- <u>Romans 6:1-2</u>: What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase? 2 Far from it! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?
- <u>Romans 6:15</u>: What then? Are we to sin because we are not under the Law but under grace? Far from it!

 <u>Galatians 3:1-3</u>: You foolish Galatians, who has bewitched you, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was publicly portrayed as crucified? 2 This is the only thing I want to find out from you: did you receive the Spirit by works of the Law, or by hearing with faith? 3 Are you so foolish? Having begun by the Spirit, are you now being perfected by the flesh?

Justification

• <u>Romans 3:21-26</u>: But now apart from the Law **the righteousness** of God has been revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, 22 but it is the **righteousness of God** through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; for there is no distinction, 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus, 25 whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. This was to **demonstrate His righteousness**, because in God's merciful restraint He let the sins previously committed go unpunished; 26 for the demonstration, that is, of **His righteousness** at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

 2 Corinthians 5:21: He made Him who knew no sin to be sin in our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

He was always God and never ceased being God

- John 10:30: I and the Father are one."
- Hebrews 1:3: And He is the radiance of His glory and the exact representation of His nature, and upholds all things by the word of His power.
- <u>Hebrews 13:8</u>: Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today, and forever.

He never became an actual sinner

- <u>1 John 3:5</u>: You know that He appeared in order to take away sins; and in Him there is no sin.
- <u>1 Peter 2:22</u>: He who committed no sin, nor was any deceit found in His mouth;
- <u>Hebrews 13:8</u>: Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today, and forever.

So what happened? He bore the punishment for our sin

 <u>Isaiah 53:5</u>: But He was pierced for our offenses, He was crushed for our wrongdoings; The punishment for our well-being was laid upon Him, And by His wounds we are healed. <u>1 Peter 3:18</u>: For Christ also suffered for sins once for all time, the just for the unjust, so that He might bring us to God (right standing), having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit;

It is a gift

 <u>Romans 3:24</u>: says we are **justified as a gift** by His grace through Christ

We stand guilty on our own

- <u>Roman 3:23</u>: for **all have sinned** and fall short of the glory of God,
- <u>Romans 6:23</u>: For the wages of sin is death,

We receive this gift

- <u>Romans 5:1</u>: Therefore, having been **justified by faith**, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,.
- <u>Romans 4:3-5</u>: For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness." 4 Now to the one who works, the wages are not credited as a favor, but as what is due. 5 But to the one who does not work, but believes in Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is credited as righteousness,

What happens when we receive this gift?

 His righteousness is imputed to us. Meaning His righteousness is credited to our account and our sin is credited to His account.

And how do we hear about this gift?

• <u>Romans 10:17</u>: So faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ.

So what happens when we become the righteousness of God?

- We Are Born Again (John 3: 3)
- We Become Sons and Daughters (Galatian 3:26)
- We Are Clothed In Christ (Galatians 3:27)
- We Are a New Creation (2 Corinthians 5: 17)
- We Become Part of the Body (1 Corinthians 12:13)
- We Are Sealed By the Spirit (Ephesians 1:13)

Sanctification



 <u>Hebrews 10:10</u>: By this will, we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all time. <u>1 Thessalonians 4:3</u>: For this is the will of God, **your** sanctification; that is, that you abstain from sexual immorality;

Word

- John 17:17: **Sanctify** them in the truth; Your **word** is truth.
- <u>1 Peter 2:2</u>: and like newborn babies, long for the pure milk of the **word**, so that by it you may **grow in** respect to salvation,

Spirit

- <u>Galatians 5:16</u>: But I say, **walk by the Spirit**, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh.
- <u>1 Peter 1:3</u>: for His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence.

- <u>Hebrews 12:14</u>: Pursue peace with all people, and the holiness without which no one will see the Lord.
- <u>2 Corinthians 7:1</u>: Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let's cleanse ourselves from all defilement of flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.
- <u>Romans 12:2</u>: And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind,

- <u>Romans 8:29</u>: For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become **conformed to the image of His** Son,
- <u>2 Corinthians 3:18</u>: But we all, with unveiled faces, looking as in a mirror at the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit.

• <u>Romans 8:13</u>: for if you are living in accord with the flesh, you are going to die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live.

Glorification

When do we become fully glorified?

- <u>Roman 8:30</u>: and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, **He also glorified**.
- <u>1 Corinthians 15:42</u>: So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown a perishable body, it is raised an imperishable body
- <u>1 Corinthians 15:52</u>: in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet; for the trumpet will sound & the dead will be raised imperishable, & we will be changed

God will do what He says He will do for those who believe!

- Jude 24: Now to Him who is able to protect you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory, blameless with great joy,
- <u>Philippians 1:6</u>: For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work among you will complete it by the day of Christ Jesus.
