## Paul was appealing to them for unity -- he encouraged them to take on the *mindset of Jesus*

- Phil 2:5-8 Let this mind be in you...He humbled himself, became a servant, & obedient to death
- Phil 2:12-13 work out your salvation, for God works in you to will and do his good pleasure

Phil 2:14 Do all things without grumbling or questioning, 15 <u>that you may be</u> blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish **in the midst** of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, 16 <u>holding fast to the word of life</u>, **so that in the day of Christ** I may be proud that I did not **run** in vain or **labor** in vain.

- How we live today IN THE MIDST of the world will affect our standing IN THE DAY OF CHRIST
- Paul would be proud (1) they made it (2) he did not run or labor in vain
- There are only few things that last forever...one of these is people...RUN and LABOR there

## 3 individuals who embodied the mindset of Christ & dedicated their lives to making an eternal impact Paul - Life poured out as a drink offering - and he was glad about it

Phil 2:16 (b) **so that in the day of Christ** I may be proud that I did not <u>*run*</u> in vain or <u>*labor*</u> in vain. 17 Even if I am to be **poured out as a drink offering** upon the <u>*sacrificial offering of your faith*</u>, I am **glad** and *rejoice* with you all. 18 Likewise you also should be **glad** and *rejoice* with me.

- His pride was that the outcome of his running and labor produced faithful disciples
- He was committed to this even if it means martyrdom  $\rightarrow$  poured out as a drink offering
- Suffering is not seen as a loss but as gladness and joy and complete surrender as a drink offering

## Timothy - Self-Interest, The Interest of Others, or the Interest of Jesus Christ

19 I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I too may be cheered by news of you. 20 For <u>*I have no one like him*</u>, who will be <u>genuinely concerned for your welfare</u>. **21 For they all seek their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ.** 22 But you know Timothy's proven worth, how as **a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel.** 23 I hope therefore to send him just as soon as I see how it will go with me, 24 and I trust in the Lord that shortly I myself will come also

## Epaphroditus - he nearly died for the work of Christ (see also 4:18)

25 I have thought it necessary to send to you **Epaphroditus my brother and fellow worker and fellow** soldier, and your messenger and minister to my need, 26 for he has been longing for you all and has been distressed because <u>you heard that he was ill.</u> 27 Indeed he was ill, near to death. But **God had mercy** on him, and not only on him but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow. 28 I am the more eager to send him, therefore, that you may rejoice at seeing him again, and that I may be less anxious. 29 So receive him in the Lord with all joy, and honor such men, 30 for he nearly died for the work of Christ, risking his life to complete what was lacking in your service to me.

- "Risking his life" meaning to expose oneself to extreme danger) for the cause of Christ.
- Paul instructs the Philippians to "honor such men" (Phil 2:29).
- Rom 16:3-4 ESV Greet Prisca and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus, 4 <u>who risked their necks</u> for my life, to whom not only I give thanks but all the churches of the Gentiles give thanks as well.

These men living out the mindset of Christ can become repugnant to us who value self-preservation

- Joy at pouring out life out as drink offering "to spend & be spent" life is poured out for something
- To be genuinely concerned about the welfare of others...seeking the *things important to Jesus*
- To risk your life for Christ or stay safe <u>- either road will cost you where will you invest</u>
