Background to Corinth – Acts 18:1-19

- Paul started the church in Corinth. (Acts 18:1)
- He met Aquila and Priscilla in Corinth and he stayed with them as they were all tent makers. (Acts 18:2-3)
- It was probably a mostly gentile Church as most Jews rejected his message and many Corinthians (Gentiles) believed and were baptized (Acts 18:5-8)
- Paul was in Corinth for 18 months teaching the word of God. (Acts 18:11)
- Paul then took Aquila and Priscilla with him to Ephesus and was there about three years. (Acts 18:18-19 and Acts 20:31)

Background to Corinth – General

- 3 or even possible 4 letters
- Korinthiazomai, which meant "to live immorally like a Corinthian."
- 5th largest city in the Roman empire
- Acrocorinth Large rock rising 1,800+ feet
- Church mostly made up of Gentiles
- Isthmian Games


Exodus 34:14-17

Exodus 34:14-17 — for you shall not worship any other god, because the Lord, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God— 15 otherwise you might make a covenant with the inhabitants of the land, and they would prostitute themselves with their gods and sacrifice to their gods, and someone might invite you to eat of his sacrifice, 16 and you might take some of his daughters for your sons, and his daughters might prostitute themselves with their gods and cause your sons also to prostitute themselves with their gods. 17 You shall not make for yourself any gods cast in metal.


















1 Corinthians 8:1-3

1 Now concerning food sacrificed to idols, we know that we all have knowledge. Knowledge makes one conceited, but love edifies people. 2 If anyone thinks that he knows anything, he has not yet known as he ought to know; 3 but if anyone loves God, he is known by Him

1 Corinthians 8:4-8

4 Therefore, concerning the eating of food sacrificed to idols, we know that an idol is nothing at all in the world, and that there is no God but one. 5 For even if there are socalled gods whether in heaven or on earth, as indeed there are many gods and many lords, 6 yet for us there is only one God, the Father, from whom are all things, and we exist for Him; and one Lord, Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, and we exist through Him. 7 However, not all people have this knowledge; but some, being accustomed to the idol until now, eat food as if it were sacrificed to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. 8 Now food will not bring us close to God; we are neither the worse if we do not eat, nor the better if we do eat.

Romans 14:1-4

1 Now accept the one who is weak in faith, but not to have quarrels over opinions 2 One person has faith that he may eat all things, but the one who is weak eats only vegetables 3 The one who eats is not to regard with contempt the one who does not eat, and the one who does not eat is not to judge the one who eats, for God has accepted him. 4 Who are you to judge the servant of another?

1 Corinthians 8:4-8

4 Therefore, concerning the eating of food sacrificed to idols, we know that an idol is nothing at all in the world, and that there is no God but one. 5 For even if there are so-called gods whether in heaven or on earth, as indeed there are many gods and many lords, 6 yet for us there is only one God, the Father, from whom are all things, and we exist for Him; and one Lord, Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, and we exist through Him. 7 However, not all people have this knowledge; but some, being accustomed to the idol until now, eat food as if it were sacrificed to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. 8 Now food will not bring us close to God; we are neither the worse if we do not eat, nor the better if we do eat.

1 Corinthians 8:9-13

9 But take care that this freedom of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. 10 For if someone sees you, the one who has knowledge, dining in an idol's temple, will his conscience, if he is weak, not be strengthened to eat things sacrificed to idols? 11 For through your knowledge the one who is weak is ruined, the brother or sister for whose sake Christ died. 12 And so, by sinning against the brothers and sisters and wounding their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. 13 Therefore, if food causes my brother to sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause my brother to sin.

1 Corinthians 9 Summary
