1. The Bible is our authority



- Trustworthy
- It is settled forever, unchanging, perfect
- All we need for life and godliness

The New Testament is Trustworthy

- **1. Textual evidence** words we have today are what was originally written
- **2. Genres** gospels are biographies, Paul's letters are not addressed to nonbelievers
- **3. Dating** gospels and Paul's letters written in the lifetimes of the disciples
- **4. Authorship** the 4 gospels always known by 4 names, even skeptics recognize most of Paul's letters as authentic
- **5.** Creeds early traditions summarizing Christian beliefs date to the early 30s.
- **6. Historical Criteria** events recorded in the New Testament are highly probable

- 7. Undesigned Coincidences puzzle pieces that paint a bigger picture
- **8. Archeology** findings that corroborate scriptural places, practices
- Non-Christian Sources Josephus, Tacitus
- **10. Other Christian Sources** Early church writers
- **11. The Canon** the books we have were respected and protected
- **12. Personal Transformation** from the first apostles to people today

The New Testament is the best attested book of antiquity by far!

 Ps 119:89 Your eternal word, O LORD, stands firm in heaven.


 Ps 119:160 The sum of your word is truth, and every one of your righteous rules endures forever.

2. God uses his Word to transform us

2 Tim 3: 16 All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. 17 God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work.



Luke 6:47 I will show you what it's like when someone comes to me, listens to my teaching, and then follows it. 48 It is like a person building a house who digs deep and lays the foundation on solid rock. When the floodwaters rise and break against that house, it stands firm because it is well built. 49 But anyone who hears and doesn't obey is like a person who builds a house right on the ground, without a foundation. THE POWER OF 4

A key CBE discovery is that the life of someone who engages Scripture four or more times a week looks radically different from the life of someone who does not. In fact, the lives of Christians who do *not* engage with the Bible most days of the week look no different from the lives of non-believers.





We must read it to renew our minds




We must study it faithfully to understand what it says

How should we study the Bible?



- 1. Be humble.
- 2. Accept that the text says what it says.

3. We must take scripture in context


- What is the genre?
- Who was it written to? Recognize that while the Bible is written FOR you, it was not written TO you.
- You must read it in the context of the culture it was written (what did the words used mean to the author)
- You must interpret a passage inside the bigger story.

MATTHEW 18:20

The context of Matt 18:20 is confrontation

- 15"If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back. 16But if you are unsuccessful, take one or two others with you and go back again, so that everything you say may be confirmed by two or three witnesses. 17If the person still refuses to listen, take your case to the church. Then if he or she won't accept the church's decision, treat that person as a pagan or a corrupt tax collector.
- 18"I tell you the truth, whatever you forbid on earth will be forbidden in heaven, and whatever you permit on earth will be permitted in heaven.
- 19"I also tell you this: If two of you agree here on earth concerning anything you ask, my Father in heaven will do it for you. 20 For where two or three gather together as my followers, I am there among them."



The context of Php 4:13 is contentment

10 How I praise the Lord that you are concerned about me again. I know you have always been concerned for me, but you didn't have the chance to help me. 11 Not that I was ever in need, for I have learned how to be content with whatever I have. 12 I know how to live on almost nothing or with everything. I have learned the secret of living in every situation, whether it is with a full stomach or empty, with plenty or little. 13 For I can do everything through Christ, who gives me strength. 14 Even so, you have done well to share with me in my present difficulty.
