Chronology of the kings of Israel

JEROBOAM 1 Kgs 11:26-40; 1 Kgs 12:2-32; 1 Kgs 13:1-15:25; 2 Chron 10:1-2 Chron 13:20

- Solomon built Millo, and repaired the breaches of the city of David his father. Jeroboam was a mighty man of valour: and Solomon seeing the young man that he was industrious, he made him ruler over all the charge of the house of Joseph.
- the prophet Ahijah the Shilonite found Jeroboam in the way
- And Ahijah caught the new garment that was on him, and rent it in twelve pieces: and he said to Jeroboam, Take thee ten pieces: for thus saith the Lord, the God of Israel, Behold, I will rend the kingdom out of the hand of Solomon, and will give ten tribes to thee:
- Because that they have forsaken me, and have worshipped Ashtoreth the goddess of the Zidonians, Chemosh the god of the Moabites, and Milcom the god of the children of Ammon, and have not walked in my ways, to do that which is right in mine eyes, and to keep my statutes and my judgments, as did David his father.
- But I will take the kingdom out of his son's hand, and will give it unto thee, even ten tribes.
- And unto his son will I give one tribe, that David my servant may have a light alway before me in Jerusalem
- And it shall be, if thou wilt hearken unto all that I command thee, and wilt walk in my ways, and do that is right in my sight, to keep my statutes and my commandments, as David my servant did; that I will be with thee, and build thee a sure house, as I built for David, and will give Israel unto thee.
- And I will for this afflict the seed of David, but not for ever.
- Solomon sought therefore to kill Jeroboam. And Jeroboam arose, and fled into Egypt, unto Shishak king of Egypt, and was in Egypt until the death of Solomon.
- Jeroboam and all the congregation of Israel came, and spake unto Rehoboam, saying, make our burden lighter
- when all Israel saw that the king hearkened not unto them, the people said, What portion have we in David?
- Israel departed unto their tents. Israel made Jeroboam king over all Israel
- Jeroboam said in his heart, Now shall the kingdom return to the house of David: If this people go up to do sacrifice in the house of the Lord at Jerusalem, then shall the heart of this people turn again unto their lord, even unto Rehoboam king of Judah, and they shall kill me, and go again to Rehoboam king of Judah.
- Whereupon the king took counsel, and made two calves of gold, and said unto them, It is too much for you to go up to Jerusalem: behold thy gods, O Israel, which brought thee up out of the land of Egypt.
- the Levites left their suburbs and their possession, and came to Judah and Jerusalem: for Jeroboam and his sons had cast them off from executing the priest's office unto the Lord:
- he made an house of high places, and made priests of the lowest of the people, which were not of the sons of Levi.
- this thing became a sin: for the people went to worship before the one, even unto Dan.
- others out of all the tribes of Israel such as set their hearts to seek the Lord God of Israel, left the ten tribes and came to Jerusalem, to sacrifice unto the Lord God of their fathers.
- Jeroboam ordained a feast in the eighth month, on the fifteenth day of the month, like unto the

- feast that is in Judah, and he offered upon the altar, sacrificing unto the calves that he had made
- he placed in Bethel the priests of the high places which he had made.
- behold, there came a man of God out of Judah by the word of the Lord unto Bethel: and Jeroboam stood by the altar to burn incense. He cried against the altar, O altar, altar, thus saith the Lord; Behold, a child shall be born unto the house of David, Josiah by name; and upon thee shall he offer the priests of the high places that burn incense upon thee, and men's bones shall be burnt upon thee.
- when king Jeroboam heard the saying of the man of God, that he put forth his hand from the altar, saying, Lay hold on him. And his hand, which he put forth against him, dried up, so that he could not pull it in again to him.
- the king said unto the man of God, Intreat now the face of the Lord thy God, and pray for me, that my hand may be restored me again. And the man of God besought the Lord, and the king's hand was restored him again, and became as it was before.
- After this Jeroboam returned not from his evil way, but made again of the lowest of the people priests of the high places: whosoever would, he consecrated him, and he became one of the priests of the high places.
- At that time Abijah the son of Jeroboam fell sick.
- And Jeroboam said to his wife, Arise, I pray thee, and disguise thyself, that thou be not known to be the wife of Jeroboam; and get thee to Shiloh: behold, there is Ahijah the prophet, which told me that I should be king over this people.
- the Lord said unto Ahijah, Behold, the wife of Jeroboam cometh to ask a thing of thee for her son; for he is sick: thus and thus shalt thou say unto her: for it shall be, when she cometh in, that she shall feign herself to be another woman.
- tell Jeroboam, Thus saith the Lord God of Israel, I exalted thee from among the people, and made thee prince over my people Israel, the kingdom away from the house of David, and gave it thee: and yet thou hast not been as my servant David, who kept my commandments, and who followed me with all his heart, to do that only which was right in mine eyes;
- Therefore, behold, I will bring evil upon the house of Jeroboam, and will cut off from Jeroboam his male offspring, and him that is shut up and left in Israel, and will take away the remnant of the house of Jeroboam, as a man taketh away dung, till it be all gone.
- Him that dieth of Jeroboam in the city shall the dogs eat; and him that dieth in the field shall the fowls of the air eat: for the Lord hath spoken it.
- Moreover the Lord shall raise him up a king over Israel, who shall cut off the house of Jeroboam that day: but what? even now.
- he shall give Israel up because of the sins of Jeroboam, who did sin, and who made Israel to sin.
- there was war between Rehoboam and Jeroboam all the days of his life.
- in the eighteenth year of king Jeroboam began Abijah to reign over Judah.
- He reigned three years in Jerusalem. And there was war between Abijah and Jeroboam.
- Abijah set the battle in array with an army of four hundred thousand chosen men: Jeroboam also set the battle in array against him with eight hundred thousand chosen men
- Abijah stood up upon mount Zemaraim, which is in mount Ephraim, and told them they had forsaken the Lord-to not fight against Him now by fighting Judah
- But Jeroboam caused an ambushment before Judah, and the ambushment was behind them.
- as the men of Judah shouted, it came to pass, that God smote Jeroboam and all Israel before Abijah and Judah.

- there fell down slain of Israel five hundred thousand chosen men.
- Thus the children of Israel were brought under at that time, and the children of Judah prevailed, because they relied upon the Lord God of their fathers.
- Abijah took cities from him, Bethel, Jeshanah, Ephrain, and with the towns thereof.
- Neither did Jeroboam recover strength again in the days of Abijah: and the Lord struck him, and he died.
- in the twentieth year of Jeroboam king of Israel reigned Asa over Judah.
- the days which <u>Jeroboam reigned were two and twenty years</u>
- Nadab his son reigned in his stead.

Nadab 1 Kgs 14:20; 1 Kgs 15:25-31

- And Nadab the son of Jeroboam began to reign over Israel in the second year of Asa king of Judah, and reigned over Israel two years.
- And he did evil in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the way of his father, and in his sin wherewith he made Israel to sin.
- And Baasha the son of Ahijah, of the house of Issachar, conspired against him; and Baasha smote him at Gibbethon, which belonged to the Philistines; for Nadab and all Israel laid siege to Gibbethon.
- Even in the third year of Asa king of Judah did Baasha slay him, and reigned in his stead.
- And it came to pass, when he (Baasha) reigned, that he smote all the house of Jeroboam; he left not to Jeroboam any that breathed, until he had destroyed him, according unto the saying of the Lord, which he spake by his servant Ahijah the Shilonite:

Baasha 1 Kgs 15:16-16:13, 23; 2 Chron 16:1-6;

- In the third year of Asa king of Judah began Baasha the son of Ahijah to reign over all Israel in Tirzah, twenty and four years.
- And Baasha the son of Ahijah, of the house of Issachar, conspired against him (Nadab); and Baasha smote him at Gibbethon, which belonged to the Philistines; for Nadab and all Israel laid siege to Gibbethon.
- And there was war between Asa and Baasha king of Israel all their days.
- 2 Chron 16:1 In the <u>six and thirtieth year</u> of the reign of Asa Baasha king of Israel came up <u>against Judah</u>, and <u>built Ramah</u>, to the intent that he might let none go out or come in to Asa king of Judah.
- 1 Kings 16:8 shows that Elah (the son of Baasha) began to reign in the 26th year of Asa. How is this reconciled with the 36th year of Asa?

****It is at this point we have to consider a "contradiction" in scripture. 1 Kgs 16:6-8,23 indicate that Baasha died in the 26th year of Asa's regime, so how could he attack Asa in the 36th year of Asa's reign?

The word translated as 'reign' (Hebrew word-malkuwth) in 2 Chron 16:1 is used elsewhere in scripture to denote "realm", "dynasty", "or "kingdom", rather than "reign" (2 Chron1:1; 11:17; 20:30; Neh 9:35; Esther 1:14 etc).

This 36 years is a reference to the 36 years from the division of the monarchy at which time the Judaic dynasty, of which Asa belongs, began under Rehoboam. The phrase in 2 Chron 16:1 references the kingdom over which Asa had dominion and is understood as meaning the kingdom of Asa (Judah)

as distinguished from the Northern Kingdom.

This interpretation resolves two chronological problems. First, it completely eliminates the circumstance in which Baasha apparently waited 21 years before blocking the exodus of his citizens to Judah. After Asa defeated the enormous host of Zerah the Ethiopian, in the 15th year of his reign, the 35th year of the kingdom of Judah, many came to Asa from Israel they saw the Lord was with him 2 Chron 15:9. Baasha would have lost little time in securing his borders, halting the southern flow out of Israel. In the year following the defeat of Zerah, the 16th year of Asa, the 36th year of the kingdom of Judah, Baasha fortified Ramah to stop the flow of his citizens.

The second problem this resolves is the absurdity of Baasha invading Judah 10 years after his death 1 Kgs 15:33; 1Kgs 16:8.

- And Baasha king of Israel went up against Judah, and built Ramah, that he might not suffer any to go out or come in to Asa king of Judah.
- Then Asa took all the silver and the gold that were left in the treasures of the house of the Lord, and the treasures of the king's house, and delivered them into the hand of Ben-hadad, the son of Tabrimon, the son of Hezion, king of Syria, come and break thy league with Baasha king of Israel, that he may depart from me. So Ben-hadad hearkened unto king Asa, and sent the captains of the hosts which he had against the cities of Israel
- And it came to pass, when Baasha heard thereof, that he left off building of Ramah, and dwelt in Tirzah.
- by the hand of the prophet Jehu the son of Hanani came the word of the Lord against Baasha, and against his house, even for all the evil that he did in the sight of the Lord, in provoking him to anger with the work of his hands, in being like the house of Jeroboam; and because he killed him (Nadab). Behold, I will take away the posterity of Baasha, and the posterity of his house; and will make thy house like the house of Jeroboam the son of Nebat. Him that dieth of Baasha in the city shall the dogs eat; and him that dieth of his in the fields shall the fowls of the air eat.
- So Baasha slept with his fathers, and was buried in Tirzah: and Elah his son reigned in his stead.

Elah 1 Kgs 16:6-14

- In the <u>twenty and sixth year of Asa</u> king of Judah began Elah the son of Baasha to reign over Israel in Tirzah, two years.
- And his servant Zimri, captain of half his chariots, conspired against him, as he was in Tirzah, drinking himself drunk in the house of Arza steward of his house in Tirzah, and Zimri went in and smote him, and killed him, in the twenty and seventh year of Asa king of Judah, and reigned in his stead.

Zimri 1 Kgs 16:9-20

- And Zimri went in and smote him (Elah), and killed him, in the <u>twenty and seventh year of Asa</u> king of Judah, and reigned in his stead.
- And it came to pass, when he began to reign, as soon as he sat on his throne, that he slew all the house of Baasha: he left him not one of his kinsfolks, nor of his friends.
- Thus did Zimri destroy all the house of Baasha, according to the word of the Lord, which he spake against Baasha by Jehu the prophet, for all the sins of Baasha, and the sins of Elah his son, by which they sinned, and by which they made Israel to sin, in provoking the Lord God of Israel to anger with their vanities.
- In the twenty and seventh year of Asa king of Judah did Zimri reign seven days in Tirzah.

- And the people were encamped against Gibbethon, which belonged to the Philistines. And the people that were encamped heard say, Zimri hath conspired, and hath also slain the king: wherefore all Israel made Omri, the captain of the host, king over Israel that day in the camp.
- And Omri went up from Gibbethon, and all Israel with him, and they besieged Tirzah. And it came to pass, when Zimri saw that the city was taken, that he went into the palace of the king's house, and burnt the king's house over him with fire, and died, for his sins which he sinned in doing evil in the sight of the Lord, in walking in the way of Jeroboam, and in his sin which he did, to make Israel to sin.

Tibni/Omri 1 Kgs 16:16-28; 2 Chron 22:2

- Omri went up from Gibbethon, and all Israel with him, and they besieged Tirzah. And it came to pass, when Zimri saw that the city was taken, that he went into the palace of the king's house, and burnt the king's house over him with fire, and died,
- Then were the people of <u>Israel divided into two parts: half of the people followed Tibni the son of Ginath, to make him king; and half followed Omri.</u> But the people that followed Omri prevailed against the people that followed Tibni the son of Ginath: so Tibni died, and Omri reigned.
- In the <u>thirty and first year of Asa</u> king of Judah began Omri to reign over Israel, <u>twelve years</u>: <u>six years reigned he in Tirzah.</u> (It seems like Tibni and Omri both reigned for 6 yrs until Tibni was killed or died)
- And he bought the hill Samaria of Shemer for two talents of silver, and built on the hill, and called the name of the city which he built, after the name of Shemer, owner of the hill, Samaria.
- But Omri wrought evil in the eyes of the Lord, and did worse than all that were before him for he walked in all the way of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and in his sin wherewith he made Israel to sin, to provoke the Lord God of Israel to anger with their vanities.
- So Omri slept with his fathers, and was buried in Samaria: and Ahab his son reigned in his stead.
- Athaliah was called Omri's daughter (used in a wide sense), since she was the daughter of Ahab

Ahab 1 Kgs 16:28-1 Kgs 22:41; 2 Kgs 10:1-11; 2 Chron 18:1-34

- in the thirty and eighth year of Asa king of Judah began Ahab the son of Omri to reign over Israel: and Ahab the son of Omri reigned over Israel in Samaria twenty and two years.
- And Ahab the son of Omri did evil in the sight of the Lord above all that were before him.
- as if it had been a light thing for him to walk in the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, that he took to wife Jezebel the daughter of Ethbaal king of the Zidonians, and went and served Baal, and worshipped him.
- he reared up an altar for Baal in the house of Baal, which he had built in Samaria.
- Ahab made a grove; and Ahab did more to provoke the Lord God of Israel to anger than all the kings of Israel that were before him.
- Elijah the Tishbite, who was of the inhabitants of Gilead, said unto Ahab, As the Lord God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, but according to my word.
- the word of the Lord came to Elijah in the third year, saying, Go, shew thyself unto Ahab; and I will send rain upon the earth.
- Ben-hadad the king of Syria gathered all his host together: and there were thirty and two kings

- with him, and horses, and chariots: and he went up and besieged Samaria, and warred against it.
- he sent messengers to Ahab king of Israel into the city, and said unto him, Thus saith Benhadad, thy silver and thy gold is mine; thy wives also and thy children, even the goodliest, are mine.
- king of Israel answered and said, My lord, O king, according to thy saying, I am thine, and all that I have.
- Wherefore he said unto the messengers of Ben-hadad, Tell my lord the king, All that thou didst send for to thy servant at the first I will do: but this thing I may not do.
- Ben-hadad sent unto him, and said, The gods do so unto me, and more also, if the dust of Samaria shall suffice for handfuls for all the people that follow me.
- And it came to pass, when Ben-hadad heard this message, as he was drinking, he and the kings in the pavilions, that he said unto his servants, Set yourselves in array. And they set themselves in array against the city.
- there came a prophet unto Ahab king of Israel, saying, Thus saith the Lord, Hast thou seen all this great multitude? behold, I will deliver it in to thine hand this day; and thou shalt know that I am the Lord.
- the prophet came to the king of Israel, and said unto him, Go, strengthen thy self, and mark, and see what thou doest: for at the return of the year the king of Syria will come up against thee.
- the servants of the king of Syria said unto him, Their gods are gods of the hills; therefore they were stronger than we; but let us fight against them in the plain, and surely we shall be stronger than they.
- And it came to pass at the return of the year, that Ben-hadad numbered the Syrians, and went up to Aphek, to fight against Israel.
- there came a man of God, and spake unto the king of Israel, and said, Thus saith the Lord, Because the Syrians have said, The Lord is God of the hills, but he is not God of the valleys, therefore will I deliver all this great multitude into thine hand, and ye shall know that I am the Lord.
- they pitched one over against the other seven days. And so it was, that in the seventh day the battle was joined: and the children of Israel slew of the Syrians an hundred thousand footmen in one day.
- But the rest fled to Aphek, into the city; and there a wall fell upon twenty and seven thousand of the men that were left. And Ben-hadad fled, and came into the city, into an inner chamber.
- So they girded sackcloth on their loins, and put ropes on their heads, and came to the king of Israel, and said, Thy servant Ben-hadad saith, I pray thee, let me live. And he said, Is he yet alive? he is my brother.
- Now the men did diligently observe whether any thing would come from him, and did hastily catch it: and they said, Thy brother Ben-hadad. Then he said, Go ye, bring him. Then Ben-hadad came forth to him; and he caused him to come up into the chariot.
- Ben-hadad said unto him, The cities, which my father took from thy father, I will restore; and thou shalt make streets for thee in Damascus, as my father made in Samaria. Then said Ahab, I will send thee away with this covenant. So he made a covenant with him, and sent him away.
- So the prophet waited for the king by the way, and disguised himself with ashes upon his face.
- as the king passed by, he cried unto the king: and he said, Thy servant went out into the midst of the battle; and, behold, a man turned aside, and brought a man unto me, and said, Keep this man: if by any means he be missing, then shall thy life be for his life, or else thou shalt pay a

- talent of silver. And as thy servant was busy here and there, he was gone. And the king of Israel said unto him, So shall thy judgment be; thyself hast decided it.
- And he hasted, and took the ashes away from his face; and the king of Israel discerned him that he was of the prophets. And he said unto him, Thus saith the Lord, Because thou hast let go out of thy hand a man whom I appointed to utter destruction, therefore thy life shall go for his life, and thy people for his people.
- And the king of Israel went to his house heavy and displeased, and came to Samaria.
- it came to pass after these things, that Naboth the Jezreelite had a vineyard, which was in Jezreel, hard by the palace of Ahab king of Samaria.
- And it came to pass, when Ahab heard that Naboth was dead, that Ahab rose up to go down to the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite, to take possession of it.
- And the word of the Lord came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying, Arise, go down to meet Ahab king
 of Israel, which is in Samaria: behold, he is in the vineyard of Naboth, whither he is gone down
 to possess it.
- And thou shalt speak unto him, saying, Thus saith the Lord, Hast thou killed, and also taken possession? And thou shalt speak unto him, saying, Thus saith the Lord, In the place where dogs licked the blood of Naboth shall dogs lick thy blood, even thine. Behold, I will bring evil upon thee, and will take away thy posterity, and will cut off from Ahab him that pisseth against the wall, and him that is shut up and left in Israel, And will make thine house like the house of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and like the house of Baasha the son of Ahijah, for the provocation wherewith thou hast provoked me to anger, and made Israel to sin.
- But there was none like unto Ahab, which did sell himself to work wickedness in the sight of the Lord, whom Jezebel his wife stirred up.
- And he did very abominably in following idols, according to all things as did the Amorites, whom the Lord cast out before the children of Israel.
- And it came to pass, when Ahab heard those words, that he rent his clothes, and put sackcloth upon his flesh, and fasted, and lay in sackcloth, and went softly.
- And the word of the Lord came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying, Seest thou how Ahab humbleth himself before me? because he humbleth himself before me, I will not bring the evil in his days: but in his son's days will I bring the evil upon his house.
- And they continued three years without war between Syria and Israel.
- And it came to pass in the third year, that Jehoshaphat the king of Judah came down to the king of Israel.
- Now Jehoshaphat had riches and honour in abundance, and joined affinity (his son Jehoram married Ahab's daughter Athaliah) with Ahab.
- Ahab killed sheep and oxen for him in abundance, and for the people that he had with him, and persuaded him to go up with him to Ramoth-gilead.
- And he said unto Jehoshaphat, Wilt thou go with me to battle to Ramoth-gilead? And Jehoshaphat said to the king of Israel, I am as thou art, my people as thy people, my horses as thy horses.
- Jehoshaphat said unto the king of Israel, Inquire, I pray thee, at the word of the Lord to day.
- And Jehoshaphat said, Is there not here a prophet of the Lord besides, that we might inquire of him?
- And the messenger that was gone to call Micaiah spake unto him, saying, Behold now, the words of the prophets declare good unto the king with one mouth: let thy word, I pray thee, be

- like the word of one of them, and speak that which is good. And Micaiah said, As the Lord liveth, what the Lord saith unto me, that will I speak
- Thus saith the king, Put this fellow in the prison, and feed him with bread of affliction and with water of affliction, until I come in peace. And Micaiah said, If thou return at all in peace, the Lord hath not spoken by me. And he said, Hearken, O people, every one of you.
- So the king of Israel and Jehoshaphat the king of Judah went up to Ramoth-gilead.
- And a certain man drew a bow at a venture, and smote the king of Israel between the joints of the harness: wherefore he said unto the driver of his chariot, Turn thine hand, and carry me out of the host; for I am wounded.
- So the king died, and was brought to Samaria; and they buried the king in Samaria.
- So Ahab slept with his fathers; and Ahaziah his son reigned in his stead.

Ahaziah 1 Kgs 22:40; 1 Kgs 22:49-2 Kgs 1:18; 2 Chron 20:35-37

- <u>Ahaziah</u> the son of Ahab <u>began to reign over Israel</u> in Samaria the <u>seventeenth year of Jehoshaphat</u> king of Judah, and <u>reigned two years</u> over Israel.
- Ahab went to war at Ramoth-gilead and was killed there. Ahaziah was co-rex for 1 year and sole rex for a second. Following the chart shows you how this works.
- he did evil in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the way of his father, and in the way of his mother, and in the way of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin: For he served Baal, and worshipped him, and provoked to anger the Lord God of Israel, according to all that his father had done.
- Then Moab rebelled against Israel after the death of Ahab.
- And after this did Jehoshaphat king of Judah join himself with Ahaziah king of Israel, who did very wickedly: And he joined himself with him to make ships to go to Tarshish: and they made the ships in Ezion-geber.
- Then Eliezer the son of Dodavah of Mareshah prophesied against Jehoshaphat, saying, Because thou hast joined thyself with Ahaziah, the Lord hath broken thy works. And the ships were broken, that they were not able to go to Tarshish.
- And Ahaziah fell down through a lattice in his upper chamber that was in Samaria, and was sick: and he sent messengers, and said unto them, Go, inquire of Baal-zebub the god of Ekron whether I shall recover of this disease.
- But the angel of the Lord said to Elijah the Tishbite, Arise, go up to meet the messengers of the king of Samaria, and say unto them, Is it not because there is not a God in Israel, that ye go to inquire of Baal-zebub the god of Ekron? Now therefore thus saith the Lord, Thou shalt not come down from that bed on which thou art gone up, but shalt surely die. And Elijah departed.
- Then the king sent unto him a captain of fifty with his fifty. They got burned up and so did the next group. Elijah came with the third group
- And he said unto him, Thus saith the Lord, Forasmuch as thou hast sent messengers to inquire of Baal-zebub the god of Ekron, is it not because there is no God in Israel to inquire of his word? therefore thou shalt not come down off that bed on which thou art gone up, but shalt surely die.
- So he died according to the word of the Lord which Elijah had spoken. And <u>Jehoram (the son of Ahab) reigned in his stead in the second year of Jehoram the son of Jehoshaphat king of Judah; because he had no son.</u>

Jehoram (Joram) 2 Kgs 1:17; 2 Kgs 3:1-27; 2 Kgs 8:16,25-2 Kgs 9:29; 2 Chron 22:2-7

- So he (Ahaziah) died according to the word of the Lord which Elijah had spoken. And Jehoram reigned in his stead in the <u>second year of Jehoram</u> the son of Jehoshaphat king of Judah; because he had no son. ***compare the next verse****
- Now Jehoram the son of Ahab began to reign over Israel in Samaria the <u>eighteenth year of</u> <u>Jehoshaphat</u> king of Judah, and reigned twelve years.
- According to the graph, Jehoram (of Judah) was in the second year as pro-rex, which was the 18th year of Jehoshaphat.
- And he wrought evil in the sight of the Lord; but not like his father, and like his mother: for he put away the image of Baal that his father had made. Nevertheless he cleaved unto the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, which made Israel to sin; he departed not therefrom.
- But it came to pass, when Ahab was dead, that the king of Moab rebelled against the king of Israel
- 1 Kings 22:47 There was then no king in Edom: a deputy was king.
- Mesha king of Moab was a sheepmaster, and rendered unto the king of Israel an hundred thousand lambs, and an hundred thousand rams, with the wool.
- And king Jehoram went out of Samaria the same time, and numbered all Israel.
- And he went and sent to Jehoshaphat the king of Judah, saying, The king of Moab hath rebelled against me: wilt thou go with me against Moab to battle? And he said, I will go up: I am as thou art, my people as thy people, and my horses as thy horses.
- And he (Jehoram) said, Which way shall we go up? And he (Jehoshaphat) answered, The way through the wilderness of Edom.
- So the king of Israel went, and the king of Judah, and the king of Edom: and they fetched a compass of seven days' journey: and there was no water for the host, and for the cattle that followed them.
- And the king of Israel said, Alas! that the Lord hath called these three kings together, to deliver them into the hand of Moab!
- But Jehoshaphat said, Is there not here a prophet of the Lord, that we may inquire of the Lord by him? And one of the king of Israel's servants answered and said, Here is Elisha the son of Shaphat, which poured water on the hands of Elijah. And Jehoshaphat said, The word of the Lord is with him. So the king of Israel and Jehoshaphat and the king of Edom went down to him.
- And Elisha said unto the king of Israel, What have I to do with thee? get thee to the prophets of thy father, and to the prophets of thy mother. And the king of Israel said unto him, Nay: for the Lord hath called these three kings together, to deliver them into the hand of Moab.
- And Elisha said, As the Lord of hosts liveth, before whom I stand, surely, were it not that I regard the presence of Jehoshaphat the king of Judah, I would not look toward thee, nor see thee.
- But now bring me a minstrel. And it came to pass, when the minstrel played, that the hand of the Lord came upon him. And he said, Thus saith the Lord, Make this valley full of ditches.
- And this is but a light thing in the sight of the Lord: he will deliver the Moabites also into your hand.
- And they said, This is blood: the kings are surely slain, and they have smitten one another: now therefore, Moab, to the spoil.

- And when they came to the camp of Israel, the Israelites rose up and smote the Moabites, so that they fled before them: but they went forward smiting the Moabites, even in their country.
- And when the king of Moab saw that the battle was too sore for him, he took with him seven hundred men that drew swords, to break through even unto the king of Edom: but they could not.
- Then he took his eldest son that should have reigned in his stead, and offered him for a burnt offering upon the wall. And there was great indignation against Israel: and they departed from him, and returned to their own land.
- Forty and two years old was Ahaziah when he began to reign, and he reigned one year in Jerusalem. His mother's name also was Athaliah the daughter of Omri. He also walked in the ways of the house of Ahab: for his mother was his counsellor to do wickedly. Wherefore he did evil in the sight of the Lord like the house of Ahab: for they were his counsellors after the death of his father to his destruction. He walked also after their counsel, and went with Jehoram the son of Ahab king of Israel to war against Hazael king of Syria at Ramoth-gilead: and the Syrians smote Joram. And he returned to be healed in Jezreel because of the wounds which were given him at Ramah, when he fought with Hazael king of Syria. And Azariah the son of Jehoram king of Judah went down to see Jehoram the son of Ahab at Jezreel, because he was sick.
- Elijah coming out of the hiding place- And he said, I have been very jealous for the Lord God of hosts: because the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword; and I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away. And the Lord said unto him, Go, return on thy way to the wilderness of Damascus: and when thou comest, anoint Hazael to be king over Syria: And Jehu the son of Nimshi shalt thou anoint to be king over Israel: and Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah shalt thou anoint to be prophet in thy room. (God told Elijah who passed on the instructions to Elisha)
- And Elisha came to Damascus; and Ben-hadad the king of Syria was sick; and it was told him, saying, The man of God is come hither.
- And the king said unto Hazael, Take a present in thine hand, and go, meet the man of God, and inquire of the Lord by him, saying, Shall I recover of this disease?
- And Elisha said unto him, Go, say unto him, Thou mayest certainly recover: howbeit the Lord hath shewed me that he shall surely die.
- And he settled his countenance stedfastly, until he was ashamed: and the man of God wept. And Hazael said, Why weepeth my lord? And he answered, Because I know the evil that thou wilt do unto the children of Israel: their strong holds wilt thou set on fire, and their young men wilt thou slay with the sword, and wilt dash their children, and rip up their women with child. (this is the Hazael that they were fighting)
- And Elisha the prophet called one of the children of the prophets, and said unto him, Gird up thy loins, and take this box of oil in thine hand, and go to Ramoth-gilead: And when thou comest thither, look out there Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat the son of Nimshi, and go in, and make him arise up from among his brethren, and carry him to an inner chamber; Then take the box of oil, and pour it on his head, and say, Thus saith the Lord, I have anointed thee king over Israel. Then open the door, and flee, and tarry not. **Elisha fulfilled the word given to Elijah
- So Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat the son of Nimshi conspired against Joram. (Now Joram had kept Ramoth-gilead, he and all Israel, because of Hazael king of Syria. But king Joram was returned to be healed in Jezreel of the wounds which the Syrians had given him, when he fought with Hazael king of Syria.)

- But king Joram was returned to be healed in Jezreel of the wounds which the Syrians had given him, when he fought with Hazael king of Syria.) And Jehu said, If it be your minds, then let none go forth nor escape out of the city to go to tell it in Jezreel. (He did not want Jehoram to have any idea of what was going to take place)
- So Jehu rode in a chariot, and went to Jezreel; for Joram lay there. And Ahaziah king of Judah was come down to see Joram.
- And there stood a watchman on the tower in Jezreel, and he spied the company of Jehu as he came, and said, I see a company. And Joram said, Take an horseman, and send to meet them, and let him say, Is it peace?
- And Joram said, Make ready. And his chariot was made ready. And Joram king of Israel and Ahaziah king of Judah went out, each in his chariot, and they went out against Jehu, and met him in the portion of Naboth the Jezreelite.
- And it came to pass, when Joram saw Jehu, that he said, Is it peace, Jehu? And he answered, What peace, so long as the whoredoms of thy mother Jezebel and her witchcrafts are so many?
- And Joram turned his hands, and fled, and said to Ahaziah, There is treachery, O Ahaziah.
- And Jehu drew a bow with his full strength, and smote Jehoram between his arms, and the arrow went out at his heart, and he sunk down in his chariot.
- But when Ahaziah the king of Judah saw this, he fled by the way of the garden house. And Jehu followed after him, and said, Smite him also in the chariot. And they did so at the going up to Gur, which is by Ibleam. And he fled to Megiddo, and died there.
- And the destruction of Ahaziah was of God by coming to Joram: for when he was come, he went out with Jehoram against Jehu the son of Nimshi, whom the Lord had anointed to cut off the house of Ahab.

Jehu 1 Kgs 19:10-17; 2 Kgs 9:1-10:36; 2 Kgs 15:2; 2 Chron 22:7-9

- Elijah coming out of the hiding place- And he said, I have been very jealous for the Lord God of hosts: because the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword; and I, even I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away. And the Lord said unto him, Go, return on thy way to the wilderness of Damascus: and when thou comest, anoint Hazael to be king over Syria: And Jehu the son of Nimshi shalt thou anoint to be king over Israel: and Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah shalt thou anoint to be prophet in thy room. And it shall come to pass, that him that escapeth the sword of Hazael shall Jehu slay: and him that escapeth from the sword of Jehu shall Elisha slay.
- And Elisha the prophet called one of the children of the prophets, and said unto him, Gird up thy loins, and take this box of oil in thine hand, and go to Ramoth-gilead: And when thou comest thither, look out there Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat the son of Nimshi, and go in, and make him arise up from among his brethren, and carry him to an inner chamber; Then take the box of oil, and pour it on his head, and say, Thus saith the Lord, I have anointed thee king over Israel. Then open the door, and flee, and tarry not. **Elisha fulfilled the word given to Elijah
- And Jehu drew a bow with his full strength, and smote Jehoram between his arms, and the arrow went out at his heart, and he sunk down in his chariot.
- And when <u>Jehu was come to Jezreel</u> (after killing Jehoram), Jezebel heard of it; and she painted her face, and tired her head, and looked out at a window.
- And he said, Throw her down. So they threw her down: and some of her blood was sprinkled on the wall, and on the horses: and he trode her under foot.

- Wherefore they came again, and told him. And he said, This is the word of the Lord, which he spake by his servant Elijah the Tishbite, saying, In the portion of Jezreel shall dogs eat the flesh of Jezebel: And the carcase of Jezebel shall be as dung upon the face of the field in the portion of Jezreel; so that they shall not say, This is Jezebel.
- And Ahab had seventy (could include grandsons) sons in Samaria. And Jehu wrote letters, and sent to Samaria, unto the rulers of Jezreel, to the elders, and to them that brought up Ahab's children, saying, Now as soon as this letter cometh to you, seeing your master's sons are with you, and there are with you chariots and horses, a fenced city also, and armour; Look even out the best and meetest of your master's sons, and set him on his father's throne, and fight for your master's house.
- But they were exceedingly afraid, and said, Behold, two kings stood not before him: how then shall we stand?
- And he that was over the house, and he that was over the city, the elders also, and the bringers up of the children, sent to Jehu, saying, We are thy servants, and will do all that thou shalt bid us; we will not make any king: do thou that which is good in thine eyes.
- Then he wrote a letter the second time to them, saying, If ye be mine, and if ye will hearken unto my voice, take ye the heads of the men your master's sons, and come to me to Jezreel by to morrow this time. Now the king's sons, being seventy persons, were with the great men of the city, which brought them up.
- And it came to pass, when the letter came to them, that they took the king's sons, and slew seventy persons, and put their heads in baskets, and sent him them to Jezreel.
- And when he was departed thence, he lighted on Jehonadab the son of Rechab coming to meet him: and he saluted him, and said to him, Is thine heart right, as my heart is with thy heart? And Jehonadab answered, It is. If it be, give me thine hand. And he gave him his hand; and he took him up to him into the chariot.
- And he said, Come with me, and see my zeal for the Lord. So they made him ride in his chariot.
- And he arose and departed, and <u>came to Samaria (about 20 miles from Jezreel or from Megiddo)</u>. And as he was at the <u>shearing house in the way</u>, Jehu met with the brethren of Ahaziah king of Judah, and said, Who are ye? And they answered, We are the brethren of Ahaziah; and we go down to salute the children of the king and the children of the queen. And he said, Take them alive. And they took them alive, and slew them at the pit of the shearing house, even two and forty men; neither left he any of them.
- And when he came to Samaria, he slew all that remained unto Ahab in Samaria, till he had destroyed him, according to the saying of the Lord, which he spake to Elijah.
- Know now that there shall fall unto the earth nothing of the word of the Lord, which the Lord spake concerning the house of Ahab: for the Lord hath done that which he spake by his servant Elijah.
- And Jehu gathered all the people together, and said unto them, Ahab served Baal a little; but Jehu shall serve him much.
- Now therefore call unto me all the prophets of Baal, all his servants, and all his priests; let none be wanting: for I have a great sacrifice to do to Baal; whosoever shall be wanting, he shall not live. But Jehu did it in subtilty, to the intent that he might destroy the worshippers of Baal.
- And they brake down the image of Baal, and brake down the house of Baal, and made it a draught house unto this day. Thus Jehu destroyed Baal out of Israel.
- And the Lord said unto Jehu, Because thou hast done well in executing that which is right in

- mine eyes, and hast done unto the house of Ahab according to all that was in mine heart, thy children of the fourth generation shall sit on the throne of Israel.
- But Jehu took no heed to walk in the law of the Lord God of Israel with all his heart: howbeit from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin, Jehu departed not from after them, to wit, the golden calves that were in Bethel, and that were in Dan.
- In those days the Lord began to cut Israel short: and Hazael smote them in all the coasts of Israel: From Jordan eastward, all the land of Gilead, the Gadites, and the Reubenites, and the Manassites, from Aroer, which is by the river Arnon, even Gilead and Bashan.
- And Jehu slept with his fathers: and they buried him in Samaria. And <u>Jehoahaz his son reigned</u> in his stead.
- And the time that Jehu reigned over Israel in Samaria was twenty and eight years.

Jehoahaz 2 Kgs 10:35; 2 Kgs 13:1-10; 2 Kgs 13:22,25

- In the three and twentieth year of Joash the son of Ahaziah king of Judah Jehoahaz the son of Jehu began to reign over Israel in Samaria, and reigned seventeen years.
- And he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord, and followed the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, which made Israel to sin; he departed not therefrom.
- And the anger of the Lord was kindled against Israel, and he <u>delivered them into the hand of Hazael king of Syria</u>, and into the hand of Ben-hadad the son of Hazael, all their days.
- Ben-hadad the son of Hazael took cities away from Jehoahaz
- But Hazael king of Syria oppressed Israel all the days of Jehoahaz.
- And Jehoahaz besought the Lord, and the Lord hearkened unto him: for he saw the oppression of Israel, because the king of Syria oppressed them.
- (And the <u>Lord gave Israel a saviour, so that they went out from under the hand of the Syrians</u>: and the children of Israel dwelt in their tents, as beforetime.
- Nevertheless they departed not from the sins of the house of Jeroboam, who made Israel sin, but walked therein: and there remained the grove also in Samaria.)
- Neither did he leave of the people to Jehoahaz but fifty horsemen, and ten chariots, and ten thousand footmen; for the king of Syria had destroyed them, and had made them like the dust by threshing.
- And Jehoahaz slept with his fathers; and they buried him in Samaria: and Joash his son reigned in his stead.
- Was it in the last three years of his reign that they came out from the hand of Syria? Is that the reason why Jehoash was pro-rex? (emphasis mine)

Jehoash (Joash) 2 Kgs 13:9-25; 2 Chron 25:17-25; 2 Kgs 13:24-25; 2 Kgs 14:8-16

- In the thirty and seventh year of Joash king of Judah began Jehoash the son of Jehoahaz to reign over Israel in Samaria, and reigned sixteen years.
- And he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord; he departed not from all the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel sin: but he walked therein.
- And the rest of the acts of Joash, and all that he did, and his might wherewith he fought against Amaziah king of Judah, are they not written in the book of the Chronicles of the kings of Israel?
- Now Elisha was fallen sick of his sickness whereof he died. And Joash the king of Israel came down unto him, and wept over his face, and said, O my father, my father, the chariot of Israel, and the horsemen thereof.

- And Elisha said unto him, Take bow and arrows. And he took unto him bow and arrows. And he said to the king of Israel, Put thine hand upon the bow. And he put his hand upon it: and Elisha put his hands upon the king's hands.
- And the man of God was wroth with him, and said, Thou shouldest have smitten five or six times; then hadst thou smitten Syria till thou hadst consumed it: whereas now thou shalt smite Syria but thrice.
- But Hazael king of Syria oppressed Israel all the days of Jehoahaz.
- And the Lord was gracious unto them, and had compassion on them, and had respect unto them, because of his covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and would not destroy them, neither cast he them from his presence as yet.
- So Hazael king of Syria died; and Ben-hadad his son reigned in his stead.
- And <u>Jehoash the son of Jehoahaz took again</u> out of the hand of Ben-hadad the son of Hazael the cities, <u>which he had taken out of the hand of Jehoahaz his father by war</u>. Three times did Joash beat him, and recovered the cities of Israel.
- Then Amaziah king of Judah took advice, and sent to Joash, the son of Jehoahaz, the son of Jehu, king of Israel, saying, Come, let us see one another in the face.
- And Joash king of Israel sent to Amaziah king of Judah, saying, The thistle that was in Lebanon sent to the cedar that was in Lebanon, saying, Give thy daughter to my son to wife: and there passed by a wild beast that was in Lebanon, and trode down the thistle.
- Thou sayest, Lo, thou hast smitten the Edomites; and thine heart lifteth thee up to boast: abide now at home; why shouldest thou meddle to thine hurt, that thou shouldest fall, even thou, and Judah with thee?
- And Jehoash slept with his fathers, and was buried in Samaria with the kings of Israel; and Jeroboam his son reigned in his stead.

Jeroboam (II) 2 Kgs 13:13; 2 Kgs 14:23-29; Hos 1:1; Amos 1:1; Amos 7: 8-17

- The word of the Lord that came unto <u>Hosea</u>, the son of Beeri, in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, and <u>in the days of Jeroboam</u> the son of Joash, king of Israel.
- The words of <u>Amos</u>, who was among the herdman of Tekoa, which he saw concerning Israel in the days of Uzziah king of Judah, and in the <u>days of Jeroboam</u> the son of Joash king of Israel, two years before the earthquake. *Read Amos to see what God was saying at that time!!!!*
- In the <u>fifteenth year of Amaziah</u> the son of Joash king of Judah <u>Jeroboam</u> the son of <u>Joash king of Israel</u> began to reign in Samaria, and reigned <u>forty and one years</u>.
- And he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord: he departed not from all the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin.
- He restored the coast of Israel from the entering of Hamath unto the sea of the plain, according to the word of the Lord God of Israel, which he spake by the hand of his servant <u>Jonah</u>, the son of Amittai, the prophet, which was of Gath-hepher.
- For the Lord saw the affliction of Israel, that it was very bitter: for there was not any *shut up*, nor any left, nor any helper for Israel.
- And the Lord said not that he would blot out the name of Israel from under heaven: but he saved them by the hand of Jeroboam the son of Joash.
- Now the rest of the acts of Jeroboam, and all that he did, and his might, how he warred, and how he recovered Damascus, and Hamath, which belonged to Judah, for Israel, are they not

written in the book of the Chronicles of the kings of Israel?

Amos 7:11-17

For thus Amos saith, Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel shall surely be led away captive out of their own land.

- 12 Also Amaziah said unto Amos, O thou seer, go, flee thee away into the land of Judah, and there eat bread, and prophesy there:
- 13 But prophesy not again any more at Bethel: for it is the king's chapel, and it is the king's court.
- 14 Then answered Amos, and said to Amaziah, I was no prophet, neither was I a prophet's son; but I was an herdman, and a gatherer of sycomore fruit:
- 15 And the Lord took me as I followed the flock, and the Lord said unto me, Go, prophesy unto my people Israel.
- 16 Now therefore hear thou the word of the Lord: Thou sayest, Prophesy not against Israel, and drop not thy word against the house of Isaac.
- 17 Therefore thus saith the Lord; Thy wife shall be an harlot in the city, and thy sons and thy daughters shall fall by the sword, and thy land shall be divided by line; and thou shalt die in a polluted land: and Israel shall surely go into captivity forth of his land.
- (My emphasis) Could this prophecy indicate that there was trouble at the end of Jeroboam's reign and possibly became subservient to another nation?

Zachariah 2 Kgs 14:29; 2 Kgs 15:8-12

- And Jeroboam slept with his fathers, even with the kings of Israel; and Zachariah his son reigned in his stead.
- In the <u>thirty and eighth year of Azariah</u> king of Judah did Zachariah the son of Jeroboam reign over Israel in Samaria six months.
- And he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord, as his fathers had done: he departed not from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin.
- And Shallum the son of Jabesh conspired against him, and smote him before the people, and slew him, and reigned in his stead.
- This was the word of the Lord which he spake unto Jehu, saying, Thy sons shall sit on the throne of Israel unto the fourth generation. And so it came to pass.
- Either there was an interregnum at the death of Jeroboam until the 38th year of Azariah when Zachariah reigned for only 6 months, or could what Amos prophesied have made the Northern Kingdom subservient to another nation under Jerobaom and Zachariah was only a puppet ruler until the 38th year of Azariah? There is no mention of the total length of time that he reigned in scripture.

Shallum 2 Kgs 15:8-15

- Shallum the son of Jabesh began to reign in the <u>nine and thirtieth year of Uzziah king of Judah</u>; and he reigned a full month in Samaria.
- For Menahem the son of Gadi went up from Tirzah, and came to Samaria, and smote Shallum the son of Jabesh in Samaria, and slew him, and reigned in his stead.
- And the rest of the acts of Shallum, and his conspiracy which he made, behold, they are written in the book of the Chronicles of the kings of Israel.

Menahem 2 Kgs 15:14-22

• For Menahem the son of Gadi went up from Tirzah, and came to Samaria, and smote Shallum

- the son of Jabesh in Samaria, and slew him, and reigned in his stead.
- Then Menahem smote Tiphsah, and all that were therein, and the coasts thereof from Tirzah: because they opened not to him, therefore he smote it; and all the women therein that were with child he ripped up.
- In the <u>nine and thirtieth year of Azariah</u> king of Judah began <u>Menahem</u> the son of Gadi to reign over Israel, and reigned ten years in Samaria.
- And he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord: he departed not all his days from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin.
- And Pul the king of Assyria came against the land: and Menahem gave Pul a thousand talents of silver, that his hand might be with him to confirm the kingdom in his hand.
- And Menahem exacted the money of Israel, even of all the mighty men of wealth, of each man fifty shekels of silver, to give to the king of Assyria. So the king of Assyria turned back, and stayed not there in the land.
- Pehahiah his son reigned in his stead

Pekahiah 2 Kgs 15:22-26

- In the <u>fiftieth year of Azariah</u> king of Judah <u>Pekahiah</u> the son of Menahem began to reign over Israel in Samaria, and <u>reigned two years</u>.
- And he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord: he departed not from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin.
- But <u>Pekah</u> the son of Remaliah, a captain of his, <u>conspired against him</u>, and smote him in Samaria, in the palace of the king's house, with Argob and Arieh, and with him fifty men of the Gileadites: <u>and he killed him</u>, and reigned in his room.

Pekah 2 Kgs 15:23-31; 2 Kgs 15:37-16:5; 2 Chron 28:1-15; Isa 7:1

- But Pekah the son of Remaliah, a captain of his, conspired against him (Pekahiah), and smote him in Samaria, in the palace of the king's house, with Argob and Arieh, and with him fifty men of the Gileadites: and he killed him, and reigned in his room.
- In the <u>two and fiftieth year of Azariah</u> king of Judah <u>Pekah</u> the son of Remaliah <u>began to reign</u> over Israel in Samaria, and reigned twenty years.
- And he did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord: he departed not from the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin.
- in the <u>seventeenth year of Pekah</u> the son of Remaliah <u>Ahaz</u> the son of Jotham king of Judah began to reign.
- Then Rezin king of Syria and Pekah son of Remaliah king of Israel came up to Jerusalem to war: and they besieged Ahaz, but could not overcome him.
- And it was told the house of David, saying, Syria is confederate with Ephraim. And his heart was moved, and the heart of his people, as the trees of the wood are moved with the wind.
- Then said the Lord unto Isaiah, Go forth now to meet Ahaz, thou, and Shear-jashub thy son, at the end of the conduit of the upper pool in the highway of the fuller's field; And say unto him, Take heed, and be quiet; fear not, neither be fainthearted for the two tails of these smoking firebrands, for the fierce anger of Rezin with Syria, and of the son of Remaliah. Because Syria, Ephraim, and the son of Remaliah, have taken evil counsel against thee, saying, Let us go up against Judah, and vex it, and let us make a breach therein for us, and set a king in the midst of it, even the son of Tabeal:

- Thus saith the Lord God, It shall not stand, neither shall it come to pass. For the head of Syria is Damascus, and the head of Damascus is Rezin; and within threescore and five years shall Ephraim be broken, that it be not a people. And the head of Ephraim is Samaria, and the head of Samaria is Remaliah's son. If ye will not believe, surely ye shall not be established.
- Moreover the Lord spake again unto Ahaz, saying, Ask thee a sign of the Lord thy God; ask it either in the depth, or in the height above. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, neither will I tempt the Lord. And he said, Hear ye now, O house of David; Is it a small thing for you to weary men, but will ye weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. Butter and honey shall he eat, that he may know to refuse the evil, and choose the good. For before the child shall know to refuse the evil, and choose the good, the land that thou abhorrest shall be forsaken of both her kings.
- And I went unto the prophetess; and she conceived, and bare a son. Then said the Lord to me, Call his name Maher—shalal—hash—baz. For before the child shall have knowledge to cry, My father, and my mother, the riches of <u>Damascus and the spoil of Samaria shall be taken away before the king of Assyria.</u>
- The Lord spake also unto me again, saying, Forasmuch as this people refuseth the waters of Shiloah that go softly, and rejoice in Rezin and Remaliah's son; Now therefore, behold, the Lord bringeth up upon them the waters of the river, strong and many, even the king of Assyria, and all his glory: and he shall come up over all his channels, and go over all his banks:
- For Pekah the son of Remaliah slew in Judah an hundred and twenty thousand in one day, which were all valiant men; because they had forsaken the Lord God of their fathers.
- And the children of Israel carried away captive of their brethren two hundred thousand, women, sons, and daughters, and took also away much spoil from them, and brought the spoil to Samaria. But a prophet of the Lord was there, whose name was Oded: and he went out before the host that came to Samaria, and said unto them, Behold, because the Lord God of your fathers was wroth with Judah, he hath delivered them into your hand, and ye have slain them in a rage that reacheth up unto heaven.' And now ye purpose to keep under the children of Judah and Jerusalem for bondmen and bondwomen unto you: but are there not with you, even with you, sins against the Lord your God? Now hear me therefore, and deliver the captives again, which ye have taken captive of your brethren: for the fierce wrath of the Lord is upon you.
- Then certain of the heads of the children of Ephraim, Azariah the son of Johanan, Berechiah the son of Meshillemoth, and Jehizkiah the son of Shallum, and Amasa the son of Hadlai, stood up against them that came from the war, And said unto them, Ye shall not bring in the captives hither: for whereas we have offended against the Lord already, ye intend to add more to our sins and to our trespass: for our trespass is great, and there is fierce wrath against Israel.
- So the armed men left the captives and the spoil before the princes and all the congregation. And the men which were expressed by name rose up, and took the captives, and with the spoil clothed all that were naked among them, and arrayed them, and shod them, and gave them to eat and to drink, and anointed them, and carried all the feeble of them upon asses, and brought them to Jericho, the city of palm trees, to their brethren: then they returned to Samaria.
- At that time Rezin king of Syria recovered Elath to Syria, and drave the Jews from Elath: and the Syrians came to Elath, and dwelt there unto this day.
- So <u>Ahaz sent messengers to Tiglath-pileser king of Assyria</u>, saying, I am thy servant and thy son: come up, and save me out of the hand of the king of Syria, and out of the hand of the king of Israel, which rise up against me.

- And Ahaz took the silver and gold that was found in the house of the Lord, and in the treasures of the king's house, and sent it for a present to the king of Assyria. And the king of Assyria hearkened unto him: for the king of Assyria went up against Damascus, and took it, and carried the people of it captive to Kir, and slew Rezin.
- <u>In the days of Pekah king of Israel came Tiglath-pileser king of Assyria</u>, and took Ijon, and Abel-beth-maachah, and Jonoah, and Kedesh, and Hazor, and Gilead, and Galilee, all the land of Naphtali, and carried them captive to Assyria.
- And the God of Israel stirred up the spirit of Pul king of Assyria, and the spirit of Tilgathpilneser king of Assyria, and he carried them away, even the Reubenites, and the Gadites, and the half tribe of Manasseh, and brought them unto Halah, and Habor, and Hara, and to the river Gozan, unto this day. (about 75% of the Northern Kingdom taken)
- And Hoshea the son of Elah made a conspiracy against Pekah the son of Remaliah, and smote him, and slew him, and reigned in his stead, in the twentieth year of Jotham the son of Uzziah. This would actually be the 4th year of Ahaz. (Here we have another anomaly since Jotham only reigned 16 yrs. The date is probably reckoned from the beginning of his rule to underscore the Lord's displeasure against wicked Ahaz for: (1) calling upon Tiglath-pileser for help instead of the Living God, (2) having Urijah, the high priest, build an altar like that at Damascus at which he might inquire, (3) cutting off the borders of the bases, removing the laver off them, and taking down the laver from off the brasen oxen that were under it, (4) sacrificing unto the gods of Damascus, (5) shutting up the doors of the temple in Jerusalem, (6) making altars and placing them at every corner in Jerusalem, and (7) making high places to burn incense unto other gods in every city of Judah

Hoshea 2 Kgs 15:30; 2 Kgs 17:1-18:12; 2 Kgs 16:19-20; 2 Chron 28:26-27

- And Hoshea the son of Elah made a conspiracy against Pekah the son of Remaliah, and smote him, and slew him, and reigned in his stead, in the twentieth year of Jotham the son of Uzziah.
- In the <u>twelfth year of Ahaz king</u> of Judah began Hoshea the son of Elah to reign in Samaria over Israel nine years.
- How could Hoshea begin to reign in the 4th year of Ahaz and then in the 12th year?
- Hoshea slew Pekah in the 4th year of Ahaz's reign, but did not become king until the 12th year of Ahaz. The king of Assyria had taken over 75% of the Northern Kingdom, anarchy seemed to reign, who could be found to rule at such a time?
- The scriptures show that Israel did have a king at this time but it was not Hoshea. Scriptures refer to Ahaz not only as the king of Judah, but also bearing the title "King of Israel" (2 Chron 28:19, 26-27). So it would appear that upon the death of Pekah, the Assyrian vassal Ahaz, having the religious demeanor of the kings of Israel (2 Kgs 16:1-4,9-18), was viewed as then being "king" of Israel as well. Perhaps Tiglath-pileser placed his vassal in authority over the conquered Northern Kingdom and bestowed the title "King of Israel" upon Ahaz, though he remained in Jerusalem and Hoshea functioned as the "on site" overseer in Samaria.
- Ahaz walked in the way of the kings of Israel, his acts were written in the chronicles of Judah and Israel, he was buried in Jerusalem-<u>but they brought him not into the sepulchres of the kings of Israel.</u>
- Now it came to pass in the <u>third year of Hoshea</u> son of Elah king of Israel, that <u>Hezekiah the son of Ahaz king of Judah began to reign.</u>
- And he (Hoshea) did that which was evil in the sight of the Lord, but not as the kings of Israel that were before him.

- Against him came up Shalmaneser king of Assyria; and Hoshea became his servant, and gave him presents.
- And the king of Assyria found conspiracy in Hoshea: for he had sent messengers to So king of Egypt, and brought no present to the king of Assyria, as he had done year by year: therefore the king of Assyria shut him up, and bound him in prison.
- Then the <u>king of Assyria</u> came up throughout all the land, and went up to Samaria, and <u>besieged</u> it three years.
- And it came to pass in the <u>fourth year of king Hezekiah</u>, which was the <u>seventh year of Hoshea</u> son of Elah king of Israel, that Shalmaneser king of Assyria came up against Samaria, and besieged it.
- In the <u>ninth year of Hoshea</u> the <u>king of Assyria took Samaria</u>, and carried Israel away into <u>Assyria</u>, and placed them in Halah and in Habor by the river of Gozan, and in the cities of the Medes.
- And at the end of three years they took it: <u>even in the sixth year of Hezekiah</u>, that is the <u>ninth</u> year of Hoshea king of Israel, Samaria was taken.
- And the children of Israel did secretly those things that were not right against the Lord their God, and they built them high places in all their cities, from the tower of the watchmen to the fenced city. And they set them up images and groves in every high hill, and under every green tree: and there they burnt incense in all the high places, as did the heathen whom the Lord carried away before them; and wrought wicked things to provoke the Lord to anger: for they served idols, whereof the Lord had said unto them, Ye shall not do this thing.
- Yet the Lord testified against Israel, and against Judah, by all the prophets, and by all the seers, saying, Turn ye from your evil ways, and keep my commandments and my statutes, according to all the law which I commanded your fathers, and which I sent to you by my servants the prophets. Notwithstanding they would not hear, but hardened their necks, like to the neck of their fathers, that did not believe in the Lord their God.
- And they rejected his statutes, and his covenant that he made with their fathers, and his testimonies which he testified against them; and they followed vanity, and became vain, and went after the heathen that were round about them, concerning whom the Lord had charged them, that they should not do like them.
- And they left all the commandments of the Lord their God, and made them molten images, even two calves, and made a grove, and worshipped all the host of heaven, and served Baal. and they caused their sons and their daughters to pass through the fire, and used divination and enchantments, and sold themselves to do evil in the sight of the Lord, to provoke him to anger.
- Therefore the Lord was very angry with Israel, and removed them out of his sight: there was none left but the tribe of Judah only.
- And the Lord rejected all the seed of Israel, and afflicted them, and delivered them into the hand of spoilers, until he had cast them out of his sight.
- For he rent Israel from the house of David; and they made Jeroboam the son of Nebat king: and Jeroboam drave Israel from following the Lord, and made them sin a great sin. For the children of Israel walked in all the sins of Jeroboam which he did; they departed not from them; Until the Lord removed Israel out of his sight, as he had said by all his servants the prophets. So was Israel carried away out of their own land to Assyria unto this day.
- And the <u>king of Assyria brought men from Babylon</u>, and from Cuthah, and from Ava, and from Hamath, and from Sepharvaim, and placed them in the cities of Samaria instead of the children

- of Israel: and they possessed Samaria, and dwelt in the cities thereof.
- And so it was at the beginning of their dwelling there, that <u>they feared not the Lord</u>: therefore the Lord sent lions among them, which slew some of them.
- Then one of the priests whom they had carried away from Samaria came and dwelt in Bethel, and taught them how they should fear the Lord.
- Howbeit every nation made gods of their own, and put them in the houses of the high places which the Samaritans had made, every nation in their cities wherein they dwelt.

This was the last of the Kingdom of Israel, only Judah remained!
